

## SPOTLIGHT ON WYNNE FERGUSON

My task: to look back over major influences in my life,

#### which enabled me to become versatile in several creative activities.

My sister Jocelyn was three years older and therefore always brighter than I was! We always had a competition between us going on. My awareness of what to do and what not to do was usually from Jocelyn.

At pre-walking stage I had crawled around the side of those — when suddenly Joc called out loudly "mum" — "Wynnes eating dirt". My mother's reaction was to give me a 'garden' to look after. She taught me the difference between weeds and flowers. Later she gave me a 'patch' in the vegetable garden where Mum and Dad give me plants and seeds to use. She gave me a small peach tree as I was enthusiastic about climbing trees — she taught me to prune peach trees and let me do the large trees too. So began my love of gardening and I used to hear mum tell friends that I gardened before going to school.

Early childhood was very significant and moulds the way the adult develops – good

or bad.



My sister and I were very lucky to go to the Fielding Community Centre where a famous couple, Mr and Mrs HD Summerset introduced the first Pre-School Play centre in New Zealand.



and was a Dux.

Playschool was amazing. They also introduced adult education and acting and crafts. Mum attended New Education Fellowship – discussions of all kinds of topics. Mum had come top of every subject including Art, Music and secondary school

Dad was in "Merry England" and made props. Everyone said he had a good "Voice". He was a chemist and during the WWII he was prevented from going to war because he was in the Home Guard and had been since 18 years old – specialising in communications. His job was considered an essential service.



My mother was a Karatane Nurse and developed programmes for sick babies — when their mothers couldn't manage them. She said getting a sick baby to swallow ½ a spoonful of chicken soup was very good progress. She did spinning and weaving at the community centre and knitting to send to the soldiers at war. She taught me these skills and also cane weaving. Jocelyn and I had

a competition about who got the most money from the  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$  and 3rds at the local flower shows – four shows a year.

After two years and a diploma in Education at Christchurch Teachers College, I won a third year Specialist Training in Arts and Crafts at Dunedin Teacher College. Only ten places were awarded each year for "Specialists". We were sent into schools to help teachers make their lessons more enjoyable for the children. The course was initiated by Dr Clarence Beeby – a former Director General of Education Department. Gordon Tovey – National Supervisor of Art and Craft was to enthuse the specialists and train them in new methods and many other specialists shared ideas.
